



**KKR Income Opportunities Fund Declares Monthly Distributions of \$0.125 Per Share and  
Announces Quarterly Investor Call Date**

New York, NY, July 31, 2014—KKR Income Opportunities Fund (the “Fund”) (NYSE: KIO) today announced its monthly distributions of \$0.125 per common share, payable on the dates below. Based on the Fund’s initial public offering price of \$20.00 per share and current share price of \$18.14 (as of its close on July 30, 2014), the distributions represent an annualized distribution rate of 7.5% and 8.3% respectively (calculated by annualizing the distribution amount and dividing it by the IPO share price or current price, as the case may be).
