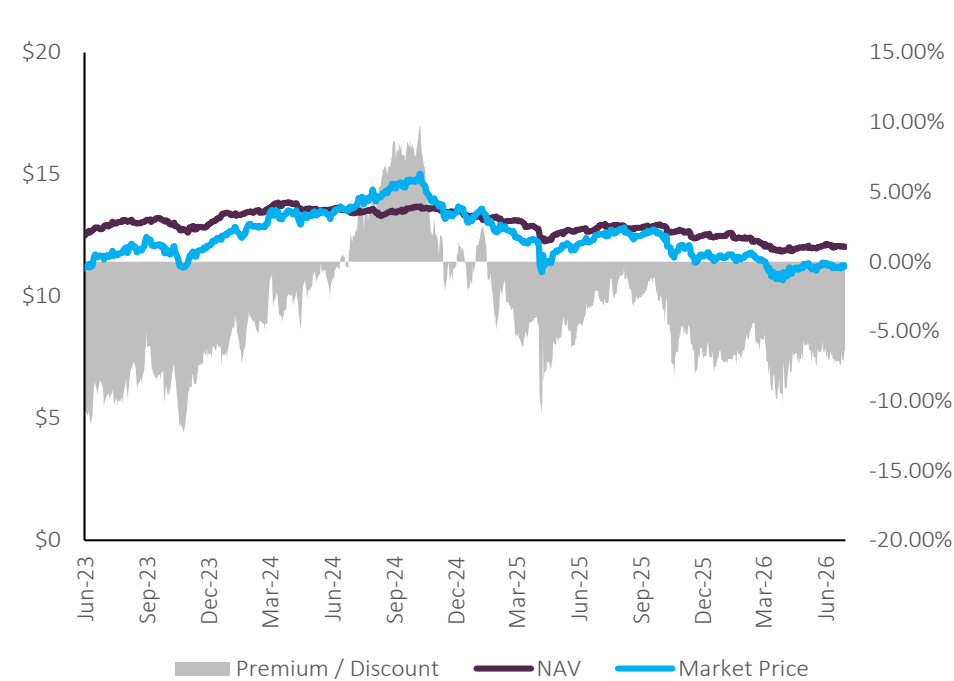

- The Fund has issued 2,000,000 shares of mandatory redeemable preferred shares, \$.001 par value per share with a liquidation preference of \$25 per share, for an aggregate issuance price of \$50,000,000 designated as “Series A Mandatory Redeemable Preferred Shares” (the MRP Shares).
 - The Fund has entered into a financing facility with a major financial institution. Under the terms of the financing facility, the Fund has access to committed financing of up to \$250,000,000. While the use of leverage can result in greater returns in a rising market as well as increased income generation, its use can also generate greater losses in a declining market as well as pressure income levels in an environment of higher borrowing costs. The Fund is required to maintain prescribed asset coverage for its borrowings and may be required to reduce its leverage at an inopportune time if the Fund’s asset values decline. Leveraged in percentage terms represents the amount of leverage as a percent of total managed assets.

 - Refers to the annual interest rate received on a debt instrument. Expressed as a weighted average of debt instruments in the portfolio, based on market value in reporting currency. This measure is inclusive of Fund Leverage.
 - Measures the annual return received if a debt instrument is held until maturity. Expressed as a weighted average of debt instruments in the portfolio, based on market value in reporting currency. This measure is inclusive of Fund Leverage.
 - Based on Standard and Poor’s (S&P) ratings as applicable. Credit ratings measure the quality of a bond based on the issuer’s creditworthiness, with ratings ranging from AAA, being the highest, to D, being the lowest based on S&P’s measures. Ratings of BBB or higher by S&P are considered to be investment grade quality. Credit ratings BB and below are lower-rated securities (junk bonds). High-yielding, non-investment-grade bonds (junk bonds) involve higher risks than investment-grade bonds. Adverse conditions may affect the issuer’s ability to pay interest and principal on these securities. A portion of the portfolio’s securities may not be rated.  - Distribution rate calculated as current dividend rate, annualized over 12 months, divided by the closing Market Price per share. The Market Price is the price at which shares trade on the New York Stock Exchange and may differ from the Fund’s Net Asset Value.
 - Distribution rate calculated as current dividend rate, annualized over 12 months, divided by the closing NAV per share. NAV represents the per-share value of the Fund’s underlying holdings and may be higher or lower than the Market Price at which shares trade.
 - Shareholders should not assume dividends are solely based on net investment income and may include a return of capital. Dividends are computed in accordance with US generally accepted accounting principles (US GAAP). The timing and character of distributions for federal income tax purposes are determined in accordance with income tax regulations, which differ from US GAAP. As such, the portion of distributions reported as a return of capital on your federal income tax return may differ from the amounts reported above. The final tax character of distributions will be reported to shareholders on IRS Form 1099-DIV after year end.
